

Personal Protective Equipment – Mask Policy and Logistics	Issue Date: March 29, 2020

PURPOSE: To provide clear and consistent guidelines on appropriate levels of protection and to ensure that adequate PPE is available to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in Shelby County. Guidance is subject to change based on evolution of pandemic.

- 1. Each agency must attempt to procure PPE through their normal procurement process. When PPE needs exceed procurement capacity, requests for PPE should be made to the Joint Task Force.
 - Government agencies shall send request through ESF5 who will prioritize and pass to ESF7 to fulfill the request.
 - All healthcare agencies shall send requests through ESF8 who will prioritize and forward to ESF5 who will record the request and the forward to ESF7 to fulfill the request.
- 2. Each agency shall establish a weekly burn or usage rate and shall provide update by COB on each Friday through the same channels as above.
- 3. Requests shall be for no more than a 1-week supply of masks.
- 4. Below please see guidance for acceptable levels of mask PPE:

Healthcare Providers	N95 (Note 1)	Surgical (note 1)
1 st Responder	N95	Surgical
Critical Infrastructure	Surgical	Social Distancing
Customer Service	N/A	Social Distancing
General Public (with underlying conditions)	Surgical mask	Social Distancing
General Public	N/A	Social Distancing

5. Masks conservation strategies shall be implemented to minimize burn rate of masks.
